The Executive Director of Student Affairs will serve as a non-voting member, providing necessary advice and ensuring proper procedure is followed. The members will be trained by the Executive Director.

Responsibility (charge):

The Tenure Advisory Committee may consider matters pertaining to tenure or academic freedom referred to it by members of the university community. Additionally, the Tenure Advisory Committee is responsible for appointing the faculty committee from within or outside its own membership and for its functioning in those cases of non reappointment and termination for cause when an untenured tenure-track faculty member alleges that a decision not to reappoint him or her is based on improper rationale as identified in OP 06.23. The committee will determine its own procedural rules.

In all cases, the committee functions as a recommending body to the president. The president's decision is final in cases involving non-reappointment or termination for cause of untenured tenure-track faculty.

Appointment:

The committee consists of five tenured faculty and two ex-officio member, who are the PVPAA and the dean selected by the Deans' Council. Each undergraduate college will elect one member. Each dean's office will prepare and distribute ballots to the faculty of the respective college. Only tenured faculty teaching full time are eligible for election.

Term of office:

Elected members serve two-year terms. Elected faculty members will not be eligible to serve consecutive terms. The Deans' Council member will serve for three years but will not be eligible to serve consecutive terms.

Responsibility (charge):

To adjudicate occurrences of student misconduct. The University Discipline Committee will conduct disciplinary Hearings in referred cases after they have completed Office of Student Affairs training. In cases involving Academic Misconduct, the Committee will be comprised only of students and faculty. In cases including discrimination, sexual misconduct, or other sensitive issues, the Committee will only include faculty and staff. A quorum for the Committee Consists of five (5) members provided that at least one (1) member is present from each of the representative categories.

Appointment:

Appointments will be made as follows:

- a) The President of the Student Government Association is invited to make recommendations for full-time student Committee members. Upon recommendation and review, full time student members will be appointed by the Executive Director of Student Affairs or designee.
- b) The President of the Faculty Senate is invited to make recommendations for full-time faculty Committee members. Upon recommendation and review, full-time faculty members will be appointed by the Executive Director of Student affairs or designee.
- c) The President of the Staff Senate is invited to make recommendations for full-time staff Committee members. Upon recommendation and review, full-time staff members will be appointed by the Executive Director of Student Affairs or designee.

The Director of Title IX Compliance or the Executive Director of Student Affairs or designee may appoint additional members of the University Discipline Committee to expedite the orderly disposition of cases and/or to aid in the administration of the conduct process within the University. The additional members of the University Discipline Committee will complete the same training, have the same composition of membership, the same duties, and the same authority as the original University Discipline Committee.

Terms of Office:

Each member will be appointed for a single one-year term by the Director of Title IX Compliance and the Executive Director of Student Affairs, in consultation with the Assistant Director of Student Conduct. Committee members may be re-appointed for consecutive one-year terms, but must complete Office of Student Affairs training each year.

Chairperson:

The Senior Executive Assistant to the President and General Counsel serves as the standing Chair of the University Discipline Committee and only votes in cases of a tie.

The chair of a Committee Hearing will be selected prior to the commencement of a University Discipline Hearing and will be a member of the faculty or staff. The chairperson is responsible for composing the Committee's decision, rationale, and appropriate sanctions.
