## Spanish for Kids

## How to Earn Dollars Babysitting

This course, certified by the American Red Cross, is designed to train youth in grades six through nine to baby sit. A parent's primary concern is whether the babysitter can handle an emergency situation. Youth can learn CPR and first aid skills by using manikins, bandages, and splinting materials. By the end of this course, youth should be ready to care for children and to earn a little extra money. After successfully completing the class, youth can be certified as a babysitter as well as being certified in CPR and first

aid. Participants should bring a sack lunch with them to class. *Joyce Gray is a certified CPR and First Aid Trainer for the American Heart Association and a licensed Emergency Medical Technician with the Texas Department of Health.* Fee: \$55

## Basic Horsemanship

This introductory class for adults and youth fifteen years-of-age and older explores the basics of horses and horsemanship. Class is designed to foster a basic understanding of the responsibility of owning and caring for horses among individuals who wish to interact with and learn about horses. Specific areas to be studied include: 1) safety and rules around horses; 2) horse breeds and colors; 3) the history of horses and how they came to exist; 4) horse care (including brushing, bathing, feeding, and basic veterinary science); 5) handling, haltering, leading, and tying up a horse; 6) horse equipment; 7) saddling a horse; 8) riding a horse; and 9) making a horse stop, turn, and respond to its rider.

To participate, you must wear good fitting boots with a heel, jeans/riding pants, and a comfortable shirt; you may wish to bring a container of iced water each day to class. A liability release must be completed, signed, and returned to the Division of Extended Studies one week prior to the first class. Stone Arbor Training Stables provides helmets, equipment, and the horses. Class does not meet November 20. *Tim Smith began riding and working with horses as a child and has been a riding instructor for fourteen years.* Fee: \$170
