- Two letters of recommendation from ASU faculty
- Successful interview with the SI Director

# Keys to Becoming a Successful Student



- 1) Attend class regularly.
- 2) Refer to and follow the class syllabus often.
- 3) Read assigned text and additional readings before each class.
- 4) Listen and take notes during lecture.
- 5) Review class notes every day and make a list of questions that need to be answered.
- 6) Compare class notes with other students.
- 7) Visit the professor during office hours to ask questions.
- 8) Think about the course material between class meetings.
- 9) Plan ahead so you don't have to cram for exams or write rush papers.
- 10) Attend SI sessions regularly—once a week!
