Information Technology (IT) manages five computer labs on campus for general student use and for scheduled classes and events. The MCS 111 lab is available 24 hours a day Monday through Thursday when classes are in session. For additional computer lab hours visit the website. There are over 100 computer applications available in the labs, including MS Office, Adobe Photoshop, Macromedia Dreamweaver, and Corel Draw. Each lab is equipped with scanner stations, black and white laser printing, headphones, and microphones. Color laser printing is available in the MCS and Library labs for a nominal cost of ten cents a page. Black and white printing is included at no additional charge. Lab Assistants are always on duty to answer questions and are trained in a variety of software applications.

First-generation college students are students who would be the first in their families to complete a higher education through two- and four-year postsecondary institutions. The University offers first-generation students an opportunity to connect with faculty/staff, organizations, events, and programs that will enrich their college experience. The First-Generation Program includes:

- The mentor program – First-Generation RAMS (Raising and Meeting Standards)—is designed to equip first-generation students with the knowledge and skills necessary for success in higher education.
- ASU also offers first-generation students an opportunity to join a Host Family Program, which consists of matching students with a local “host family” to help students feel welcome and settle into life as a college student.

The First-Generation Program currently offers four (4) academic scholarships for first-generation students. The scholarships cover in-state tuition and fees for the Fall and Spring semesters. Students may reapply for a maximum of four continuous years, provided they maintain an acceptable academic standing. Summer terms are not included in this scholarship.

The University Health Clinic is available to all students who are currently enrolled in the University in academic course work for which semester credit hours are awarded. The Clinic provides many diagnostic services and appropriate treatments on an episodic outpatient basis. It is not intended to substitute for the health maintenance care provided by a primary care provider; however, it can provide invaluable service for the student who can't see his/her private physician because of time constraints or distance. Any problem which can't be treated in the clinic may be referred off-campus for further evaluation/treatment as deemed necessary by Clinic staff.

There is no charge for examination, diagnosis, or consultation services provided by the Clinic physicians, nurse practitioners, or nurses on staff. However, there may be charges for injections or other medications not stocked in the pharmacy. Medications stocked by the Clinic and prescribed by the University medical provider will be assessed a minimal fee. Students must pay for medications that are not stocked in the Clinic.

Supplemental Instruction is an academic assistance program that uses peer-led group study to help students succeed in traditionally difficult courses. Currently, the SI Program supports 15 courses, 2 labs, and approximately 40 sections. The regularly scheduled hour-long study sessions offer students an opportunity to discuss the lecture and course material outside of class. The SI Leader facilitates collaborative study skills and strategies specific to the course. SI is available only during the fall and spring semesters and is free to all ASU students.
